Congratulations, again, to the Symphonic Band on their tenth consecutive selection to the Illinois Superstate Band Festival to be held in the Foellinger Great Hall in the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts on the University of Illinois campus in Champaign. BAND CAMP 10-11! READ CAREFULLY

Next Fall, the marching band will be competing in two or three competitions, to be determined. In August, particularly 8/9 to 8/13, we will be learning 75 percent of what is performed throughout the Fall season. A small portion of the June rehearsal time will be spent preparing for the July 4 parade. A majority of the June rehearsal time will be spent preparing Fall season material and fundamentals. Therefore, **regardless** of attendance at the July 4 parade, June/July rehearsals are EXTREMELY important.

Absences from Summer dates:

In the event of family vacations that conflict with June rehearsals, an explanation of conflict should be directed to Mr. C from the parents. Any summer camps are also excused; notify Mr. C immediately. Students should make sure that job schedules, etc. are adjusted. **August band camp rehearsals are mandatory for all. Band Fee Form

The band fee covers a variety of different costs not covered by the school budget, including:

- Clinicians who work with the students during band camp and throughout the year
- Catered meals at the various marching band competitions
- Snacks during the football games
- Dry cleaning of the marching band uniforms
- A pair of black gloves
- A T-shirt required for each band member that will be occasionally worn as a uniform

Additional Required Items (these are needed as part of the uniform and equipment needed for marching band). Returning students may also purchase these items as needed.

For All:

- Marching lyre and flipbook (available at Quinlan & Fabish)
- Black socks
- *Chalk**
- *Spiral bound index cards**
- *Shoestring (or similar) to hang index card book around the neck**
- Marching band shoes (should be ordered directly from uniform committee* – boys can use the same shoes later for concert season)
- Smartmusic Subscription for Symphonic Band members (more details will follow in November)

**These items will be available for purchase in a band camp kit from the HIA. Watch for additional details.*

For Boys (these items should be ordered directly from the uniform committee*):

- Tuxedo shirt (\$18)
- Black Bow Tie (\$3.50)

For Girls (should be ordered directly from uniform committee*):

- Concert shoes (\$25)

Additional Items (applicable to all members):

- Dry cleaning cost of concert uniform at the end of the year
- Each student will be asked to contribute at least one advertisement to the Chicagoland Band Festival program book (20 to 40 percent of all ad revenue is added to the student's account)
- Items specific to certain instruments (see band handbook for details)

Band Uniform Order/Payment Form

Welcome to the John Hersey High School Band program. Most band students are involved in both marching band and concert band seasons. For each season separate uniforms are issued to your student. The school provides most of the uniform pieces. Students are held responsible for the cost of any repair/replacement of lost or damaged school-owned items. Your student will be fitted and assigned uniforms to use. There are, however, additional items that the student is required to supply. Some of these items will be ordered in bulk from our uniform distributor to reduce cost to you (see below for specific information).

Marching Season

The marching uniform remains at school. Marching uniforms are cleaned at no additional cost (i.e., cost included with band fee). The marching season uniform consists of the following:

Uniform Item	Provided By:
Black overall pants, black jacket, marching hat, plume, black gloves*	School or cost included in band fee
Black marching shoes (same for girls and boys)*	Student (student submits order and payment to uniform committee)
Black socks*	Student (student must purchase)

*When lost or forgotten, a limited number of shoes, socks and gloves are available for performances as follows:

- Shoes – loan only, must be checked out and turned back in after each use
- Socks – Available for purchase at \$5/pair
- Gloves – Available for purchase at \$5/pair

Concert Season

The concert uniform will go home with the student. It is the student's responsibility to have the uniform cleaned at the end of the concert season. The uniform varies by gender and consists of the following:

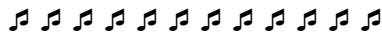
